Committee of 100 Welcomes Three New Members: Handel Lee, Elwood Lui, H. Roger Wang

(New York, NY—May 8, 2007) – Handel Lee, Partner, King & Wood; Elwood Lui, Senior Partner, Jones Day; and H. Roger Wang, Chairman and CEO, Golden Eagle International Group, have joined the Committee of 100, an organization of Chinese American leaders.

Handel Lee is a Beijing-based developer, art collector, and Partner at King & Wood, the largest PRC law firm. He is the entrepreneur developer responsible for projects such as “Three on the Bund” in Shanghai, a lifestyle complex that includes fine dining restaurants such as Jean-Georges, a contemporary art center, and luxury retail shopping, and “The Courtyard” in Beijing, a restaurant and China’s first independent contemporary art gallery. For his new project “Legation Quarter” on Beijing’s Tiananmen Square, Lee will transform the Qing Dynasty U.S. Embassy complex into an upscale lifestyle destination. In addition to real estate development, Lee serves on the Management Committee of King & Wood and formerly was its Chairman, and previously was the Head of the China Practice at Vinson & Elkins and Skadden, Arps in Beijing.

Elwood Lui is a Senior Partner in Jones Day and a member of the Firm’s Management Committee. At Jones Day, he concentrates his practice in appeals and complex commercial litigation in federal and state courts and represents major corporations and public entities in trial and appellate matters. Lui is a former associate justice of the California Court of Appeal, Second Appellate District and served as an associate justice, pro tempore, California Supreme Court. He also served as a judge of the Los Angeles Superior and the Los Angeles Municipal Court. He is the recipient of the California Judicial Council’s Bernard Witkin Amicus Curiae Award, the UCLA Alumni Professional Achievement Award, and the UCLA Law School’s Alumnus of the Year Award.

H. Roger Wang is the Chairman and CEO of Golden Eagle International Group. Founded in 1992 with headquarters in Nanjing, China, Golden Eagle began as a real estate development company in a newly opened China, focusing primarily on the province of Jiangsu. Golden Eagle has evolved into a conglomerate, maintaining not only its initial focus on real estate but also expanding its retail business into a chain of high-end department stores. Founder of the first foreign-invested group company in Nanjing, Wang is one of the most respected businessmen in the city and has received the title of “Honorary Citizen of Nanjing.”
