Buck Gee is President of the Board, and he is also a board member of Ascend/Northern California and founded Ascend's Corporate Executive Initiative, an organization of Asian corporate executives in the Bay Area. He serves on the Nominating Committee for the Chinese Historical Society of America and the Donor Advisory Committee for the Silicon Valley Community Foundation. He also serves on the advisory boards of Teranetics, a start-up IC developer, and Valladium, a start-up internet shopping web developer.

Buck retired from Cisco Systems in 2008, where he served as Vice President and General Manager of Cisco's Datacenter Business Unit. Prior to that role, he was President and CEO of Andiamo Systems, a storage area networking (SAN) switch supplier acquired by Cisco in 2004. He received BS/MSEE degrees from Stanford in 1972 and an MBA from Harvard Business School in 1980.
